<u>Blueberries:</u>	<b>Need at least 2 varieties for cross-pollination.</b> Plant in full sun with good drainage. Plant 6 - 8 feet apart in a row. Plants are potted in 1-gallon containers.
Titan	<ul> <li>Rabbiteye type blueberry</li> <li>Ripens June - July</li> <li>Very large berries</li> </ul>
Premier	<ul> <li>Rabbiteye type blueberry</li> <li>Ripens in June.</li> <li>Large berries</li> <li>Upright growth and highly productive</li> </ul>
Powderblue	<ul> <li>Rabbiteye type blueberry</li> <li>Ripens June - July</li> <li>Medium/Large berry with sweet flavor</li> <li>High yielding upright plant</li> </ul>
<u>Blackberries:</u>	Thornless upright (do not require trellising) plants can bear up to 7 weeks. Plants are self- fruitful and do not require cross-pollinating. Recommended plant spacing is 3-5 feet apart. Excellent cold hardiness. Mature plant size is 4-5 ft high and 3-4 ft wide. 2-year old potted plants are 12-24 inches upon arrival.
Navajo	<ul> <li>Thornless blackberry begins bearing fruit in 2 years.</li> <li>Ripens in June.</li> <li>Produces medium size fruit.</li> </ul>
Von	<ul> <li>New thornless blackberry just released from NC State University.</li> <li>Ripens mid to late season.</li> <li>High yielding for a duration of 6 weeks.</li> <li>Large berry with sweet flavor and very small seeds.</li> </ul>
<u>Raspberries:</u>	Plants are self-fruitful and do not require cross-pollinating. Plant 6-10 feet apart in a row. Plant in full sun.
Double Gold	<ul> <li>Two harvests per season. Summer and Fall</li> <li>Deeply blushed, golden champagne colored fruit.</li> <li>Produces large sweet berries</li> </ul>
<u>Elderberries</u>	Pair of two plants for pollination. Produces large purplish-black fruit. Ripens in August. Bears fruit in 2-3 years. Plant 6-8 feet apart. Mature plant size is 10-12 feet.
<u>Asparagus:</u>	Easy to grow. Comes in bundles of 10.
Jersey Giant	<ul> <li>Known for heavy yields and thick spears</li> <li>Large dark green spears with purple bracts</li> <li>One of the most frost hardy varieties</li> </ul>

## **Fruit Trees**

## All fruit trees are shipped bare-root individually wrapped in water retaining gel to keep moist

<u>Apples:</u>	Two-year old, bare-root trees. <b>Need two varieties for pollination.</b> Plant 12-16 feet apart. Trees are 4-5 ft upon arrival.
Pink Lady	<ul> <li>Blushing pink skin over green</li> <li>Tartness balanced with a touch of crisp, sweet flavor.</li> <li>Ripens in October</li> <li>Requires pollination.</li> </ul>
Honeycrisp	<ul> <li>Beautiful red skin over a yellow background.</li> <li>Sweet and mildly tart flavor</li> <li>Ripens late September.</li> </ul>
Granny Smith	<ul> <li>Great pollinator</li> <li>Large fruit with bright green skin</li> <li>Apple is firm and tart.</li> <li>Ripens mid-August through mid-October</li> </ul>
Arkansas Black	<ul> <li>Excellent pollinator</li> <li>Medium size fruit with dark red skin</li> <li>Flesh is firm, white, juicy and crisp</li> <li>Ripens in October to November</li> </ul>
<u>Fig:</u>	Plant 15 - 20 feet apart. Grows best in well-drained soil. Plant in full sun. Bears fruit in 3 years. Self-Fertile. Ripens late summer (July-August) Mature trees can be 15 feet high and 10 feet wide. Yield is 1-2 bushels per tree.
Brown Turkey	<ul> <li>Large purplish-brown fruit with amber colored flesh</li> <li>Very sweet and tender bell shaped figs.</li> <li>Very heavy producer</li> </ul>
Celeste	<ul> <li>Small-Medium violet brown fruit</li> <li>Most cold hardy variety</li> </ul>

• Good for fig preserves and dried fruit
