All fruit plants do best planted in an area with full sun and good drainage.

Fruit Trees

All fruit trees are delivered bare-root, wrapped and packed in water retaining gel. Trees need to be planted upon arrival for best results.

Apple Trees - Need two varieties for pollination. Trees are 4-5' with a 1/2" caliper.

Pink Lady - Large, pinkish-red fruit. Ripens Sept.- October.

Honeycrisp - Large, red fruit. Ripens September-October.

Liberty - Large fruit with yellow background with red overtones. Ripens in September.

Crimson Crisp - Large, red fruit. Ripens September.

McIntosh - Medium to large fruit is green with red speckled skin. Ripens mid September.

Fig Trees - Self-pollinating and easy to grow. Can be grown as a bush or a tree.

Brown Turkey - Medium-large fruit ripens June-August.

Celeste - Small-medium fruit ripens June-August.

Plum Trees - Trees are 4-5' with 1/2" caliper.

Methley - Medium to large fruit with purple skin and red flesh. Ripens June-July. Good pollinator.

Santa Rosa - Extra large fruit with purplish red skin and yellow flesh. Ripens June-July. Self fertile

Peach Trees - Trees are 4-5' with 1/2" caliper. Peach trees are self-fertile.

Red Haven - Medium-large fruit ripens July - August. Easy to grow with little maintenance. Heavy producer.

Loring - Large freestone fruit with yellow/red skin and yellow flesh. Ripens July-August.

Giant Fuyu Persimmon - Large, orange fruit. Bears in 2-3 years. Ripens in November. Self fertile.

Hardy Kiwi - Large, sweet fruit. Self fertile. Bears in 3-4 years. Ripens September - October.

Kousa Dogwood - flowering tree that produces edible fruit, although the fruit is typically left for the birds. Flowers in early summer and produces fruits in fall. Self fertile.

Strawberries

Come in bundles of 25 bare-root plants. June bearing varieties that produce 1 year after planting.

Earliglow - small/medium size fruit that tends to decrease in size as the season progresses. Recommended for beginners.

Sparkle - small/medium size fruit excellent for freezing and jam. Recommended for beginners.

Blackberries

2 year old plants potted in 1 gallon containers. Thorn-less upright plants are self-fertile.

Navajo - Very large sweet berries ripen in June.

Ponca - Large, very sweet berries ripen in June and have a long fruiting season.

Raspberries

2 year old plants potted in 1 gallon containers. Self-fertile.

Heritage - Medium to Large, dark red, sweet berries that ripen in July and September.

Seedless Grapes

2 year old plants potted in 1 gallon containers. Self-fertile.

Somerset - large black fruit that ripens August - September. Bears in 2-4 years.

Mars - medium to large blue fruit ripens in August. Bears in 2-4 years

Blueberries

2 year old plants potted in 1 gallon containers. Blueberries **require two varieties** for pollination.

Titan - Very large fruit. Ripens June-July.

Ochlockonee - Medium - large fruit. Ripens June-July.

Powderblue - Medium-Large fruit. Ripens June-July.

Premier - Large fruit. Ripens in June.

Asparagus

UC157 - Comes in a bundle of 10 bare-root plants.

Very productive, high yielding plants. Large uniform spears that are non-stringy.

Rhubarb

Victoria - perennial can be left in the ground and will return for many years. Very sweet, grows fast. Easy to care for.
